Grades 4th through 12th

Description: Students design their own flags on a computer and print out their own custom fabric flags on any Inkjet printer, just like paper. For school projects, flag making contests, arts & crafts, holiday & honorary recognition, sporting & club events.

Objective: To enhance students' free expression, self-esteem and computer skills while providing an easy and diverse activity that sparks imagination and creativity and leaves the student with their own creation to display with pride.

Class/Subjects Flags – Students can choose to make a flag for their favorite subject, class or study. What a way to get them thinking about their favorite part of their education! Or allow students to outline their favorite lessons for each class subject. Then compare flags amongst the students to determine which studies are making the most impact on our future leaders!

Historical study of Flags – What is the significance and purpose of the flag? Who designed and created the first flag? How has the flag evolved in design and the way a flag is used? What ways can you think of to use a flag? This study will spark ideas and discussions amongst your students.

Flag Physics – How does a flag fly? What materials are used to allow the flag to fly? How are flags designed? What proportions are appropriate for a flag size vs. the size of the flag pole? Another thought provoking study for students.

What does a flag say about a person or a region? - Students can Create-A-Flag based on their values, qualities and individual preferences with colors and symbols that represent their principles. This is an ideal project to initiate an introspective reflection of moral character within your students and build self esteem.
